Journalist Opening Leads Summary

This chart summarizes the conventional methods of Journalist Leads, including special cases. The principles may be violated for deceptive purposes, or to control partner's play.

Card Led,

Against Notrump or situation Against Suits

Demands unblock of Ace Denies K (except K, Q, or J, or count from AK doubleton)

(except in "gambling" 3 NT situations or when strong length is impossible, or in certain other special cases)

AK or KQ when un- King A or at most two block is not desired

QJ, AQJ, perhaps Queen K or at most two AQ10, sometimes

KQ10 with the 9 or at least 5-card length; demands J (except when strong length is impossible)

J10 but no higher Jack Q or at most two honor

A, K or Q and an interior sequence thus: AJ10, KJ10, A109, K109, K109, perhaps AQ10	Ten	J (possibly KJ10) or at most two
109 but no higher honor	Nine	10 (possibly K109 or Q109) or at most two; or 3-, 4- or 6-card suit headed by KJ9
Discourages continua- tion (Choice: Highest of equals; from 2 or 3 cards, highest equal; or second-highest, or highest safe, such card from longer suits)	Relatively high, 2-8	Except in the trump suit, lowest from an odd number or third- best from an even number
Encourages continua- tion (Choice: Usually lowest, but may lead second-lowest from 4 or more with doubtful attitude)	Relatively low, 2-8	Except in the trump suit, lowest from an odd number or third- best from an even number
Higher card; avoid 10 from scattered strength; avoid 9	From a doubleton	Higher card (except in the trump suit); avoid Q, J, 10, 9

Highest of equal honors; low from even; middle (or highest equal) from odd

As usual

Raised suit

In West's suit,* when 2-through-8 would be normal, the highest such card. In East's suit,* when 2-through-9 would be normal, and from 109xx, the highest such card. (9 shows even number; ten shows odd number).
